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Artist Statement

**"I use
language to

My photographic self-portraiture is borne of a fascination with the Existential questions 'Who am I?' and 'Why am I?'. I am interested in dissecting the mode and manner of my own being. With a nod to the absurd, I use symbolism to visualize the riddle of life. Yet, with tenderness toward the mysterious edges of self-discovery, I use language to dance with the visual, to provide wayfinding but also to reinforce mystery. I focus the camera on myself as a method of examining my personal mythology and to consider how one constructs and transforms meaning in relation to existence.

This body of work, **To Be and Become (Lost in the Becoming)**, chronicles my journey into midlife. Becoming the thing I didn't want to be – yet became, was becoming. This project began as the ten-year anniversary of my mother's death approached. I was thirty-five years old when she succumbed to cancer. As my adult life unfolds in her absence, I long intensely for her guidance and support. This work is an effort to summon her wisdom and guidance from beyond the grave and acknowledges the mysterious presence of absence.

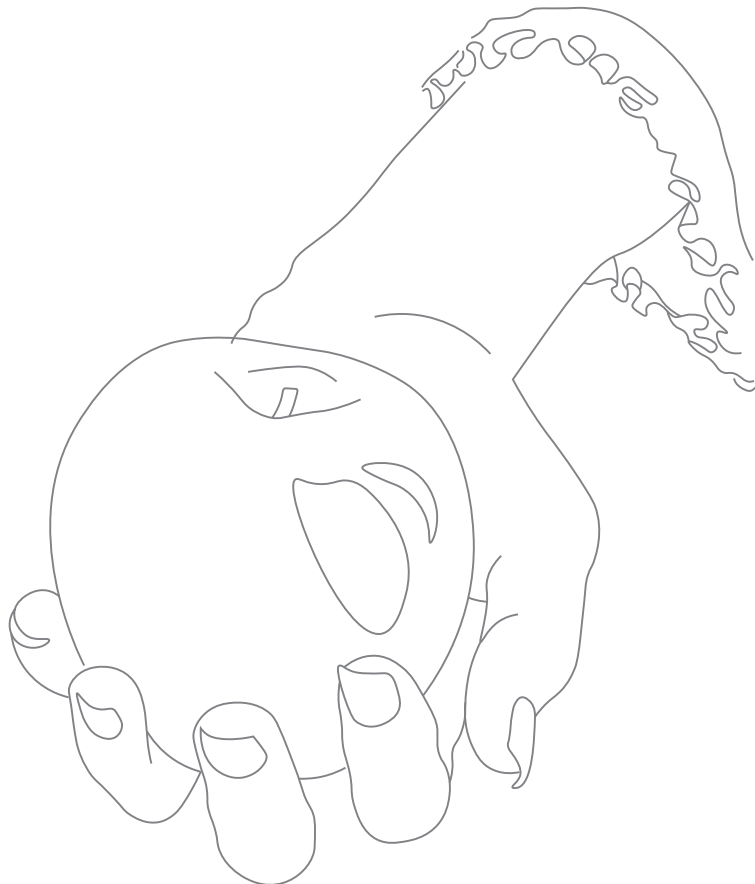

Boone 150, the Town of Boone's Sesquicentennial celebration, kicked off in January 2022 and continues throughout the year with a series of events and commemorations, including parades, historic walking tours, musical performances, and exhibitions. The Turchin Center for the Visual Arts is proud to honor this important community milestone by showcasing and celebrating artists with deep roots in Boone and across the High Country. The current exhibition features the work of Corn Wagon Thunder, a photographer and collage artist who studied at Penland School of Craft and was included in *Appalachia Now! An Interdisciplinary Survey of Contemporary Art in Southern Appalachia* at the Asheville Art Museum, North Carolina. Corn Wagon Thunder created this body of work while working and living in Boone. Although she is currently pursuing a Master of Fine Arts degree at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque, she says part of her heart will always remain in the beautiful Appalachian Mountains.

Educational Activity

Corn Wagon Thunder uses symbolism to tell stories and pose questions in her photographs. What symbols do you see in her work? What symbols would you use to represent yourself and to ask the questions you have about the world? Using these guiding questions and whatever media you like (photography, drawing, collage, etc.), create an artwork that represents how you see yourself and who you are becoming.
